Message from the Chairman...



Welcome everyone to the latest edition of the SSBA Newsletter, the first I have written as Chairman of the Association. As our previous Chairman mentioned in the Spring Newsletter we have had continued contact with the PM Rishi Sunak. This resulted in a meeting with him at the end of May. We discussed the new support scheme, and the lack of help for upland farmers as well as other pertinent matters to our industry. I would say I felt he took all on board and was very personable, however we are still waiting to see any major benefits from SFI for upland's, although I am optimistic things may start to move in the right direction.

The summer weather (if that's what you can call it) certainly made hay making difficult for many of us. However, I am a big believer in their being a positive side to everything and it did mean there was plenty of grass across country which certainly helped the Mule gimmer lamb trade. Unfortunately, this trade didn't quite pass on to the Swaledale female breeding trade with most people seeing a reduction on their year on year average. I think we all went into the tup sales with a little bit of pessimism but actually I think we got a pleasant surprise.

As with all sales some vendors do better than others but certainly the trend I witnessed was that tups with good carcass and conformation and harder wearing colours were good to sell.

I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate the Richardson family at Ghyll House for breaking the record for gaining the highest price for the breed, and then to the Lightfoot family at Gillside matching it the following day. Both tups were a credit to the hard work and dedication of the vendors - very well done!

The showing season came and went and I would like to thank everyone who takes the time to prepare and take Swaledale

sheep to shows around our Districts. It is time consuming, but a great way to advertise what we sell and a way of keeping up social contact which can be difficult at busy times. Farming can be a very lonely profession at times and it is important we take time for ourselves and reach out to others for support, often the social side of shows and sales allow us time to meet with friends and others in the profession and I personally often come away thinking 'we are not alone, others are in the same boat and have the same problems that we do'.

Shows and sales also gives us the opportunity to talk to the public and explain and celebrate all the positive things sheep farmers do for the uplands. I would like to congratulate the Hutchinson family from Hebblethwaite Hall on winning the championship at the Highland show especially when it's their first time showing and to John Dixon and family, Stainton for their success at the Yorkshire show.

Last but not least I would like to thank our secretary Rachel for all her hard work (much of it unseen). Her dedication to the breed and her forward thinking in ways to promote the breed means I think we're in safe hands moving forward. A special mention to the social media coverage across the sales period which has been commented positively by many. Finally, to Council for all their thoughts and support in my first few months, in particular to Graham Carrick our Vice-Chairman.

It's quite unbelievable how I've just got used to writing 2023, and we're looking towards 2024, it's only the beginning of November, and the Christmas adverts on television have begun in earnest!

Since the May Newsletter, the weeks have flown by, with Spring and Summer shows, NSA events, a new sale in Northern Ireland, the launch of a book to celebrate 100 years of the Association, aswell as records being broken for the sale of two shearling rams at Kirkby Stephen in October.

Sheep Events – The bi-annual flagship event for sheep farmers in the North of England took place on the East side of the country in Northumberland at the beginning of June, followed by an onfarm event, in Northern Ireland in July. The stand at these events welcomed lots of visitors, with many positive comments on the stock on display and how the stand looked. Thanks to members from D District, and Northern Ireland for their help in sourcing the sheep and support on the day.

Royal Highland Show – The Association worked with NEMSA at this years event, reducing costs by sharing transport, but also working together to promote both breeds.

Great Yorkshire Show – there was a similar number of sheep forward at this event, but with a new software programme in place for entering, the number of pens allocated for Swaledale's was insufficient for those wanting to enter resulting in some not being able to attend. The Show bases pen allocation on the previous 4 years entries, but the Association has requested more pens, and a decision will be made in February by the show organisers. The message remains that if you would like to enter at these National shows, please enter as soon as possible after the entries open.

Sponsors – Many thanks once again to the Spirit of Swaledale Gin for sponsoring the Champion prizes at the ram sales, and to all those who have placed an advert in this publication.

Video Clips – In conjunction with NEMSA, we created three short promotional videos through the summer, aired on the Facebook page, a YouTube link will be available shortly on the website for anyone who missed them. Many thanks to the Hutchinson

Family, Hebblethwaite Hall, the Porter Family, Ridding's and the Raine Family from Stanhope Gate for giving their time and access to view their stock.

'Swaledales – A Glorious Century' – A book to celebrate 100 years of the Association was launched at Muker Show in early September. Council agreed that all paid up members should receive a complimentary copy as part of their membership, further copies were sold at the show, and are now available to buy in the Yorkshire Dales National Park Shops, Hawes Auction Mart, Kirkby Stephen Auction Mart, Dales Countryside Museum Hawes, and Usha Gap Camp Site. Many thanks to Catherine Raine for helping to promote and sell the book. There are still plenty to buy, so if anyone is looking for a Christmas present idea, they retail at £20.

Facebook – this continues to be a major form of promotion for the breed and the work of the Association. The number of followers from the Page, has now increased to 11,000, and this year's most notable fact was the video of the sale of M/s Lightfoot's Reserve Champion on the Friday at Kirkby Stephen, which has now had 269,000 views!

Record Breakers – after 21 years, the record price for the sale of a shearling ram was broken on the Thursday at Kirkby Stephen, followed by it being equalled the following day. Congratulations to W Richardson & Son, Ghyll House and M/s Lightfoot, Gillside for both selling their rams for £105,000.

Finally, I would like to thank Council, our Chairman, Greg Dalton, and the District Secretaries for their work throughout 2023.



The Swaledale Sheep Breeders Association D District held their annual prize show and sale of Swaledale Rams at St John's Chapel (Barnard Castle Auction Mart) with a catalogued entry of 282, comprising 1 Aged Ram and 281 Shearling Rams.

The well supported show classes saw 29 shearlings pulled out for the Large Breeder class, 16 in the Small Breeder class, 18 in the Conformation class and 3 in the Group of Three.

The Championship was decided by judges Steven Bland and Robert Hutchinson who selected the 1st Large Breeder shearling from John Reed, Knarr Farm as the Overall Champion and the 1st Small Breeder shearling from Vanessa Reed, Knarr Farm as their Reserve Champion - a fantastic achievement for the father and daughter duo from Slaggyford.

Following a short presentation to Maurice Oxley as a show of thanks from D District for his long service on SSBA Council before retiring earlier this year, the Champion was first into the ring and what a way to start the sale. The shearling, Knarr RH1,

which was sired by a ram purchased from R Harker & Son, Grayrigg Hall, sold in a three-way split to Robert Hutchinson, Valley Farm, Peter Lightfoot, Gillside and David Allinson, West Briscoe, for £20,000. The Reserve Champion followed into the ring only a couple of shearlings later selling for £4,000 to Martin Wilson, Arngill House.

Mick Emmerson took the Conformation class title which sold for £3,400 to Tom Edgar, and Eric Gowland was placed 1st with his Group of Three, and they all sold in excess of £1,000.

It was great to see so many people around the pens and ringside, both

old and new faces created a fantastic atmosphere, credit must go to all vendors for presenting some tremendous shearlings which saw competitive bidding throughout the sale.

The sale saw 252 shearlings forward with 239 being sold making a clearance of 94.84%.

Swaledale Lamb Producer Scheme


Following over 10 years of the Swaledale Lamb Producer Scheme, due to Scotbeef being sold to ABP, and M&S varying their store formats and simplifying the lamb they offer, the original scheme has ended. M&S have decided to remove their top tier Swaledale lamb offer, and remain focused on fresh British lamb all year round with increased marketing.

The Producer Group supplied over 10,000 lambs from January through to May 2023, successfully organised by the Association, and Derek Armstrong haulage. At the time of writing, there are discussions with various processors about a new scheme, any news regarding this will be announced as and when any agreements are made.

There hasn't been a Producer Group meeting, however, the results of the Producer of the Year are as follows:

11 October 2023

Confidence was reinstated at Middleton in Teesdale Mart with an abundance of people in attendance, from vendors to buyers and general spectators, there was an evident buzz of excitement about the mart and a positive atmosphere.

Vendors produced a good quality show of Rams which made for a good line up during the show which saw 27 shearlings enter the Large Breeders class and 16 shearlings enter the Small Breeders class.

A large crowd of buvers ensured a brisk trade was witnessed with great competition ringside to see averages lift for the shearlings to an impressive £1,272.79 which is £287.89 up on last year with a 85% clearance rate, an increase of 19% on the year.

The sale leader this year was consigned by Adam Stobart, Grains O Beck with Cross Hill Kicker, the 2nd prize Small Breeders shearling, which sold for £14,000 to RS Harker, Grayrigg Hall. Second highest price of the day was consigned by E & K Bland, Cotegill with Cotegill Xray, the 4th prize Conformation shearling, which

sold for £10,000 to T.W Cowperthwaite, Tennant Gill.

Overall Champion was the 1st Large Breeders shearling from R Hutchinson & Son, Valley Farm, Valley Lorenzo, which sold for £3000 to Raymond Hutchinson, Dirt Pit Farm. Reserve Champion was 1st Small Breeders shearling from TW Hutchinson, Bail Hill with Kingshaugh Indy, which sold for £1,500 to N Hardisty.

Ram lambs topped at £1,200 for the 1st prize Large Breeders lamb from J Tully, Burncroft Farm which sold to R Collingwood, Stewart Shield Meadows.

Kirkby Stephen - Shearling Rams

As Storm Babet swept its way across the country, leaving a trail of devastation behind it, it was more Storm Swale at Kirkby Stephen C District Swaledale sale as records tumbled, with a new breed record set on the Thursday, surpassing the £101,000 set way back in 2002 in the wake of the FMD crises. This new record was then again equalled on the second day as buyers bid hard on the cream of the breed. with 29 tups hitting 5 figures or more and the average soared to £2606.25, up £333 on the year for 595 tups sold.

Setting the stage on the first day was Ghyll House Notorious, by the £22,000 Wescoe tup bought out of Kirkby two years back and out of a ewe by the £90,000 Valley Fandango, from John and Dorne Richardson, Ghyll House, Dufton. This shearling stood out from the moment he was brought out into the pre-sale show, an opening bid for £10,000 soon jumped £10,000 a time, right up to £100,000, followed by a smaller bid to £102,000, breaking the existing record, then a final bid, which came straight back, of £105,000. Notorious found a new home, with Paul & Sue Hallam, High Birkwith, and Mark Nelson, Bull & Cave.

The following day it was the turn of the Lightfoot family, based in Glenridding next to Ullswater, to have their turn in the spotlight. Placed Reserve Champion in the pre-sale show, Gillside Keeper, a son of the £16,000 John Kelsall tup bought two years previously and out of a gimmer shearling by a £9000 Richard Harker, soon rattled up to £100,000, with bids bouncing £10,000 a time. The hammer fell for the second time in two days at £105,000 to John White, Rigg and John Tully, Burncroft, with the Lightfoots retaining a share. They also saw a bid of £14,000 for their second tup in, which was by a £50,000 "Big Jack" tup bought in Hawes 2 years ago.

The Bull & Cave flock from Mark Nelson always have a pen that catches the eye, it was their first tup into the ring, Bull & Cave

Noble which drew the bidders. Sired by the £30,000 Thwaite Bridge tup, the hammer settled at £42,000, selling to David Harker, Overthwaite, and Alice Iveson, Hawes, with Mark retaining a share.

Early on the second shearling day a bid of £40,000 from John Richardson, Ghyll House saw him dip into the proceeds of his sale from the day before, for Aygill Quartz from Alan and Stephen Coates. He was by a £10,000 Priorsdale tup and out of a ewe by a Bull & Cave sire.

There was a run of high-priced tups late on the second day, with a call of £35,000 for Wescoe Ronaldo from Messrs Folder, Threlkeld. Placed 4th in the pre-sale show, he was bought in a three-way split by David Allinson, West Briscoe, John White, Rigg and Robert Hutchinson, Valley Farm. This shearling was by a £4500 Ghyll House tup and out of a ewe by a West Stonesdale sire.

Robert Wear, Howe Green, sold a strong shearling for £28,000. This tup was by the same £50,000 "Big Jack" tup that Lightfoots had sold to £14,000 earlier in the day, and out of a ewe by a Richard Harker tup. He sold to John Tunstall, S Hardisty & Son, How Hall with the Wears retaining a share.

Mark and Linda Rukin from West Stonesdale enjoyed a flying trade as they saw their pen leader, Stonesdale Novel sell for £25,000. Sired by the £22,000 Usha Gap tup while its mother was a sheep shown

at Muker back in 2014, by the Hallam tup. He sold in a two-way split to John Bland, Thwaite Bridge and Patrick Sowerby, Oakbank. Another son of the Usha Gap and out of a daughter of the old show ewe sold in an £18,000 deal to James Beckwith, New Hall.

There were a brace of tups at £20,000, one on either day. The first was from Messrs Hargreaves, Meadown Bank, with their 5th prize shearling, Meadow Bank WB34 2nd. Sired by the £34,000 West Briscoe and out of a ewe by a Richard Harker tup, he sold to Messrs Buckle, Buckles Farm and Arthur Slack, Stoneriggs.

The other at £20,000 was the Champion on the second day from John Bland, Thwaite Bridge, with Thwaite Bridge Bonanza. Sired by a Helbeck tup and out of a ewe by a Paul Hallam tup, going back to the £92,000 Christine Whitehead tup. He was bought by the judge, Richard Hargreaves, who backed his judgement, and Richard Harker, Grayrigg Hall.

Demand was strong, right from the start of the sale for powerful, well-marked shearlings, with a growing emphasis on carcase.



After the highs of Kirkby Stephen the previous week, the Hawes sale had a lot to live up to. Over the two days a total of 28 tups broke the five-figure barrier and saw the average level out at a very healthy £2338.26 over the two days for the 369 tups sold.

The Stonesdale flock, from Mark and Linda Rukin, have hit a rich seam of late, having a great trade at Kirkby Stephen, which continued at Hawes. Their sale topper, Stonesdale Noble, by a £14,000 West Briscoe tup purchased out of Middleton three years previously and out of ewe by a Bull & Cave tup, with her mother being a show ewe which won Tan Hill back in 2011, he sold to David Allinson, West Briscoe and Peter Lightfoot, Gillside, in a £42,000 deal.

He was out of the ewe which won the 2020 Tan Hill Covid photo Show and sold in their top pen of Drafts last year. She was by a Curwen tup, who himself was no stranger to the show ring, winning at Muker show as an aged tup. This powerful tup was bought by Messrs Raine, Stanhope Gate.

Their third tup, Stonesdale Nitro, Champion tup hogg at Tan Hill Show, sired by another West Briscoe tup, and out of a ewe by the £12,000 Chris Akrigg, he sold for £16,000 to Jim & James Curwen, Marshaw. Mark and Linda rounded off the day with another couple of tups selling for £9000 and £7000 apiece to complete a very satisfactory couple weeks at the Tup sales. On the second day of the sale, 1st Prize Small Breeder from Robbie Hallam, Ladybank Dreamboat, by a £9000 Mark Ewbank and out of a ewe by a Paul Ewbank. Dreamboat sold for £35,000, a personal best by some way for Robbie in a three-way split to Robert Wear, Howe Green, Messrs Lawson, Hundith and Tom & Phillip Hutton, Setmabanning.

The Usha Gap flock from Phillip Metcalfe and son James saw their pen leader by the £6000 Setmabanning tup which has already bred tups to £52,000 and £22,000 and out of a ewe by £4000 David Harker, sold for £33,000 to Haltcliffe.

Late on the second day of the sale David and Michael Allinson, West Briscoe enjoyed a good trade,topping at £28,000 with West Brisco Unique, sired by the £52,000 Usha Gap tup. His mother is by the Park Lodge tup which was Champion at Hawes when they bought him in 2018 for £28,000. This boy sold in a two-way split to Alan Bainbridge, Ash Dub and Andrew Harrison, Beckhead, both from Ettersgill. West Briscoe enjoyed a canny trade throughout their pen, with a pair of shearlings by the £45,000 Mark Ewbank Champion bought 2 years ago making £12,000 and £10,000.

One tup which certainly caught the eye, was Harkerside Ghyll House 2 from Fred

and Ruth Prescott and son John. He was by the £13,000 Ghyll House tup and out of a gimmer shearling by the £19,000 Paul Ewbank sire. He sold for £25,000 to Martin Wilson, Arngill House and Stephen Bland, Cote Gill. Harkerside sold another by the same sire for £11,000, this one heading to Christine Whitehead, Stephen Clarkson and Graham Scarr.

Richard and Gail Harker, Grayrigg Hall enjoyed a good sale with a trio of tups in the five figure bracket. The first of these was a bid of £20,000 for Grayrigg Hall BC 13, a son of the £20,000 Bull and Cave tup. He was snapped up by Will Cockbain, Rakefoot and Keith Ireland, Stackhow Hall. VETS CORNER

Following on from veterinary articles in this Newsletter over the past couple of years, and from the informative talk given by Phill Scott at the AGM back in June, this theme continues with a message to conclude general discussions which take place at shows and sales about the general future of farming.

Securing a Strong Future for the Swaledale Breed:

The farming industry has always had it's difficulties but with talk of climate change, environmental concerns and unknowns over the structure and level of future financial support to name but a few, it does feel like we are in changing and uncertain times. The businesses we run and the livestock on which they are based need to be resilient to face a future without the buffer of guaranteed subsidy as the economics of farming become ever more squeezed.

A known and optimised health status brings benefits including good fertility, mothering and milking ability, reduced losses and culls and good lamb growth. Nutrition, worms and fluke, skin parasites and lameness need a planned approach as they impact every sheep in the flock. Other chronic and endemic infectious diseases, collectively known as the 'Iceberg Diseases' may appear to affect a smaller percentage of the flock and include maedi visna (MV), ovine pulmonary adenocarcinoma (OPA) and Johne's disease. They cause poor performance, premature culling and death in individuals, but as the name suggests, more subtle under-performance in others and widespread subclinical infection through much of the flock. The exact prevalence of these diseases is unknown and varies geographically and with management systems but ewe losses of several percent annually and flock infection levels well into double figures are likely. In many flocks, the combined effects of the iceberg diseases are likely to have a significant impact.

Because of their chronic and insidious nature, we perhaps become blind to ongoing underperformance and intermittent losses. It is therefore is in the interest of flock health to monitor levels of disease. Muck samples for worms and fluke and blood samples for MV and Johnes (particularly in thin ewes) are valuable.

Post-mortem examination gives the best overall indicator of what we have, and have not got on farm, particularly regarding OPA (although ultrasound scanning of lungs by skilled operators can be a good guide). Management of the iceberg diseases is not easy but control of any disease begins with knowing what we have and is rewarded with improved productivity and profitability. Benefits of control also extend to improved value and saleability of breeding stock and confidence in a breed.

Various monitoring and full accreditation schemes are available for MV, Johne's disease and others, but the complex nature of sheep farming systems can make the rules difficult to adhere to, especially for hill flocks. Common grazing, purchase of replacements, away-wintering etc can be barriers to disease control and accreditation. However, there is increasing awareness and discussion of these diseases and the need for control so this should be embraced.

The words 'performance recording' probably bring visions of data and computers and measurements, but it's something we all do, albeit often at a simpler level. We have in our heads what we need our stock to achieve, we take note of what they do and if they fall short, we act. As the economics of farming harden, we maybe need to ask our stock to achieve more, measure more accurately what they are really achieving and be harsher on those that underperform. Individuals need sound production traits and good health status making them fit for purpose as robust commercial animals with finer breed points being the icing on the cake. This benefits our own farms and helps to ensure the role of the breed within our national flock.
